Identity Guard has recently announced that veterans affected by the recent data theft can have 6 months of Fraud Protection Service free. To learn more about this offer, go to www.fraudprotect.com

This URL will connect you to the website of "iJacking.com" which is the special veterans site of "stopijacking.com."

Because the service asks for your SSAN, I checked it's background carefully before proceeding. All of us are rightfully leery of giving out personal data these days.

Identity Guard is the identity theft service of McAfee, one of the largest major commercial personal computer and internet security companies in the world, and second only to Norton in size. It is a thoroughly reliable and trustworthy firm.

The Identity Guard public commercial guardian service normally costs \$12.95 a month. This special veterans offer by McAfee is for six months of service free, with a one-time credit card charge of \$4.95 at registration.

This is a good example of a major US company stepping up for veterans in this time when most of us are vulnerable to identity theft due to the VA's mishandling of our personal data.

I have signed up for it, and I recommend that you sign up also. I monitor my accounts and statements carefully every month, but I have a feeling we will all need some professional help in monitoring our identity security in the next few months, thanks to this major security failure at VA.

On the sign up page there is a place for a promotion code. Leave that space blank, as this page is a special one for veterans only. Don't forget to check the "I agree" box at the bottom of the form.

After you fill out the application there is a short questionnaire and an account setup page. I think that you will see from the questionnaire that the service is on the up and up.

The offer is good for those starting through 4 July 2006
