SHORT ONE FOR THE HOLIDAYS


This issue will be very short as I, like you, need to spend time with the family for the holidays.

Of the 1.5 million troops who have served in Iraq and Afghanistan, 565,901 are now veterans. Nearly one in five has been granted disability benefits.

SHINSEKI PROMISES TO OVERHAUL VETERANS AFFAIRS

President-elect Barack Obama's choice of retired Gen. Eric Shinseki, a Vietnam War veteran who sustained combat-related injuries, to lead the Department of Veterans Affairs sends a clear message to the hundreds of thousands of Iraq and Afghanistan war veterans that, unlike President George W.

Bush, Obama takes the sacrifices they have made seriously.

"When I reflect on the sacrifices that have been made by our veterans and I think about how so many veterans around the country are struggling even more than those who have not served -- higher unemployment rates, higher homeless rates, higher substance-abuse rates, medical care that is inadequate -- it breaks my heart, and I think that General Shinseki is exactly the right person who is going to be able to make sure that we honor our troops when they come home," Obama said in an interview on "Meet the Press" on the 67th anniversary of the attacks on Pearl Harbor. At a news conference in Chicago Sunday where he introduced Shinseki, Obama said "there is no one more distinguished, more determined, or more qualified to build this VA than the leader I am announcing as our next secretary of Veterans Affairs -- General Eric Shinseki," Obama said at a press conference. "No one will ever doubt that this former Army chief of staff has the courage to stand up for our troops and our veterans. No one will ever question whether he will fight hard enough to make sure they have the support they need."

Shinseki said the military "deserve a smooth, error-free, no- fail, benefits-assured transition into our ranks as veterans and that is our responsibility, not theirs."

He promised veterans that he will "work each and every day to ensure that we are serving you as well as you have served us. We will pursue a 21st century VA that serves your needs."

SUIT: U.S. DENIED VETERANS' CLAIMS

December 22, 2008 - Lawyers with Center City's Morgan Lewis & Bockius have filed a class-action suit against the Department of Defense, alleging that it illegally denied medical and disability benefits to Iraq and Afghanistan war veterans suffering from post-traumatic stress disorder.

The lawsuit said the Army failed to follow its own rules when it denied the services and payments to the veterans.

"Almost two million U.S. armed services personnel have been deployed around the world as part of the U.S. efforts to combat global terrorism," said the lawsuit, filed in the U.S. Court of Federal Claims in Washington. "Countless thousands of these service men and women have been exposed to traumatic events during combat, and many have returned home with a variety of psychological and mental injuries."

... The class-action lawsuit was filed on behalf of five Army veterans along with the National Veterans Legal Services Program, a nonprofit group that represents veterans and active service members in disputes with the government.

The veterans allege that they each were discharged from duty after an Army review board concluded that they had suffered from post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) and thus could no longer serve.

Yet, in violation of federal law, the suit contends, the veterans' disabilities were not rated severe enough to qualify them for both ongoing disability payments and medical coverage for themselves and their families.

NATIONAL GUARD AND RESERVE ACTIVATED AS OF DECEMBER 10, 2008

This week the Army, Marine Corps and Navy announced an increase, while the Air Force announced a decrease. The Coast Guard number remained the same. The net collective result is 2,889 more reservists activated than last week. At any given time, services may activate some units and individuals while deactivating others, making it possible for these figures to either increase or decrease. The total number currently on active duty from the Army National Guard and Army Reserve is 97,824; Navy Reserve, 5,885; Air National Guard and Air Force Reserve, 11,080; Marine Corps Reserve, 8,536; and the Coast Guard Reserve, 858. This brings the total National Guard and Reserve personnel who have been activated to 124,183, including both units and individual augmentees.
